

2020 Rapid Response Grant Awards
March to July 2020

African Family Health Organization

\$20,000 in April 2020 to support health access and navigation services, translation and interpretation of COVID-19 information, and emergency assistance for African and Caribbean community members.

Cambodian Association of Greater Philadelphia

\$20,000 in April 2020 to support COVID-19 response capacity and family support and case management services for Cambodian community members.

La Puerta Abierta

\$20,000 in April 2020 and \$25,000 in July 2020 to support delivery of behavioral health services, emergency financial assistance, and rental relief for Latin(x) community members.

Nationalities Service Center

\$20,000 in April 2020 to support emergency assistance to immigrant and refugee community members and to sustain operations that provide access to quality care and services that promote health and well-being.

PHL COVID-19 Fund

\$50,000 in March 2020 to the PHL COVID-19 Fund managed by the Philadelphia Foundation, United Way of Greater Philadelphia and Southern New Jersey, and the City of Philadelphia to be re-granted to local nonprofit organizations providing direct relief to community members disproportionately impacted by COVID-19.

PlayStreets

\$10,000 in July 2020 to support the Greater Philadelphia YMCA's collaboration with the City of Philadelphia Department of Parks and Recreation to provide safe, supervised play and learning activities for children and youth and access to summer meal distribution.

Prevention Point Philadelphia

\$50,000 in March 2020 to support Prevention Point Philadelphia's COVID-19 emergency response capacity to serve community members with substance use disorder and/or co-occurring mental health diagnoses and individuals who are homeless, medically fragile, and/or food insecure.

SEAMAAC

\$20,000 in April 2020 and \$25,000 in July 2020 to support health and social services programming for immigrant and refugee community members and COVID-19 hunger relief activities in South Philadelphia.

Step Up to the Plate

\$100,000 in April 2020 and \$25,000 in July 2020 to support a collaboration between Broad Street Ministry, Prevention Point Philadelphia, Project HOME, SEAMAAC, and the City of Philadelphia to provide meals and supportive services to individuals experiencing homelessness and/or housing and food insecurity.

Stop the Spread of COVID-19

\$10,000 in May 2020 to the Urban Affairs Coalition in partnership with Project HOME to purchase reusable masks for low-income Philadelphians, including seniors, children, and individuals experiencing homelessness.
