

**2020 Grant Awards**  
**March to October 2020**

**African Family Health Organization**

\$20,000 (9-month grant) to support health access and navigation services, translation and interpretation of COVID-19 information, and emergency assistance for African and Caribbean community members.

**Broad Street Ministry (fiscal agent for Step Up to the Plate)**

\$150,000 (9-month grant) to support the Step Up to the Plate collaboration between Broad Street Ministry, Prevention Point Philadelphia, Project HOME, SEAMAAC, and the City of Philadelphia to provide meals and supportive services to individuals experiencing homelessness and/or housing and food insecurity.

**Cambodian Association of Greater Philadelphia**

\$20,000 (9-month grant) to support COVID-19 response capacity and family support and case management services for Cambodian community members.

**La Puerta Abierta**

\$45,000 (9 month grant) to support delivery of behavioral health services, emergency financial assistance, and rental relief for Latin(x) community members.

**Nationalities Service Center**

\$20,000 (9-month grant) to support emergency assistance to immigrant and refugee community members and to sustain operations that provide access to quality care and services that promote health and well-being.

**Philadelphia Foundation (fiscal agent for PHL COVID-19 Fund)**

\$50,000 (4-month grant) to be re-granted to local nonprofit organizations serving community members disproportionately impacted by the health and economic impacts of COVID-19.

**Philadelphia Freedom Valley YMCA (fiscal agent for PlayStreets Program)**

\$10,000 (3-month grant) to support the Philadelphia Department of Parks and Recreation's PlayStreets program to provide safe, supervised play and learning activities and access to summer meal distribution for children and youth.

**Prevention Point Philadelphia**

\$50,000 (9-month grant) to serve community members with substance use disorder and/or co-occurring mental health diagnoses and individuals who are homeless, medically fragile, and/or food insecure.

**SEAMAAC**

\$45,000 (9-month grant) to support health and social services programming for immigrant and refugee community members and COVID-19 hunger relief activities in South Philadelphia.

**The Village of Arts and Humanities**

\$45,000 (12-month grant) to support Village Industries, a youth leadership program that provides preparation for higher education and employment and supports creative engagement with issues of racial, social, and economic justice.

**Urban Affairs Coalition (fiscal agent for Stop the Spread of COVID-19)**

\$10,000 (8-month grant) for partnership with Project HOME to purchase reusable masks for low-income Philadelphians, including seniors, children, and individuals experiencing homelessness.
